RealCare Baby 4 New Features



RealCare Baby 4 New Features

Accountability:

- Seamless Blue ID System – no more holding it up to Baby to ID

Control Center Software:

- Compatible with mixed population RCB3 and RCB4
- Start/end time schedules in 1-minute increments
- 30 schedules available
- Updated reporting

Updated Curriculum:

- Basic Infant Care – high school
- Life Skills and Healthy Choices – middle school

Baby:

- Voice recognition - responding to being talked to with babble

Care Events:

- Play time with toy rattle and giggle response

Infant Health and Safety

- Tummy time during awake

Accountability

- Seamless ID System
- Uses Bluetooth technology
- Automatically tracks and records all care activities throughout the simulation



ID Instructions and Live Demo

Make sure the ID is powered on and 8-day timer is reset.

Press and release the button on the ID.

- If the light blinks 1, 2, or 3 times, the ID is on and will remain on for 8 days.
- If no light appears, press and hold the button on the ID for 10 seconds or until you see the blue light. The ID is now on and will remain on for 8 days.
- There is no way to turn the ID off outside of removing the battery or waiting the 8 days for it to naturally turn off. It cannot be turned off by students.

Baby Interactivity

- Voice recognition - responding to being talked to with babble



Care Event – Play Time / Live Demo

Baby giggles, which signals the start of the play event

You pick the Baby up and listen for the chime

Turn the toy on

You must shake the toy every 15-20 seconds during the play event

Baby coos at the end of the event

Note: Baby will giggle throughout playtime



Infant Health and Safety

- Tummy time during awake
- Safe sleep position during asleep
- Temperature/fever



Mishandle Event

Dangerous sound exposure

- If baby is exposed to a sound over 94 dB (approximately the level of a loud car horn), it will go into a mishandle event
- Baby will cry for 67 seconds (a louder abuse cry) and you must hold and comfort Baby until it calms down

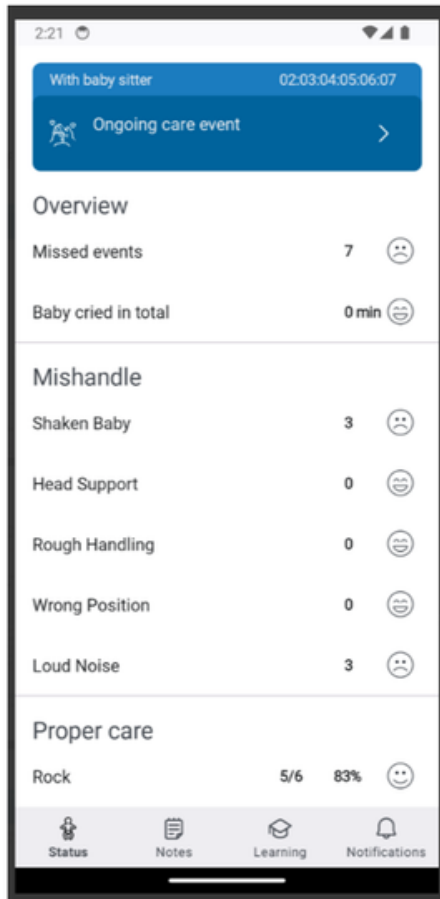
Using the RealCare Baby Student App

RealCare Baby 4 New App

- Real Time Status Information: off/on, in care event, mishandle event
- Real Time Reporting: Care events, missed events, mishandle events
- Journaling/Notes: Daily scenarios appear and/or teacher prompts to journal or write about
- Care event videos
- Safety instructions
- Temperature/Fever activity
- FAQs



RealCare Baby Guide App Overview



Status Tab: This is where you can check Baby's status and how you are doing during the simulation as well as take Baby's temperature

Notes Tab: This is where you write infant care notes to send to your teacher once the simulation is complete

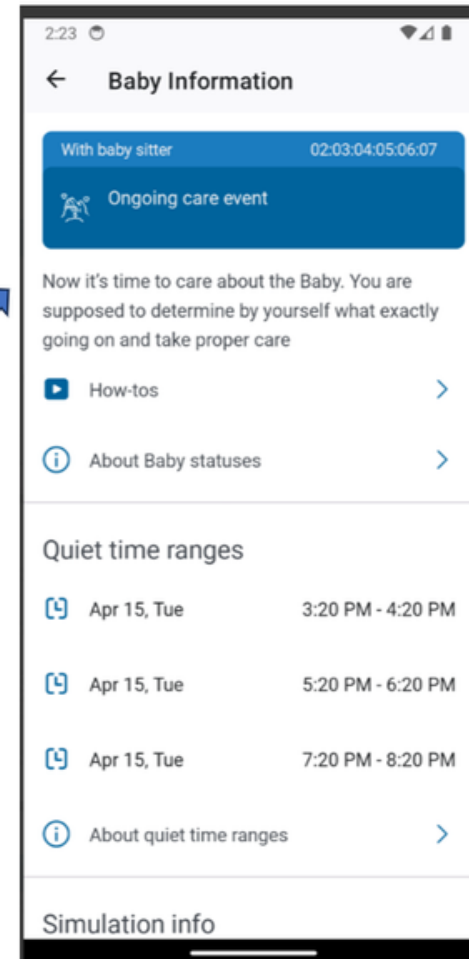
Learning Tab: This is where you learn about Baby, access Baby tips and how-to videos, learn about mishandles, view FAQs and tips for stress management, review safety precautions, and change the app's language settings

Notifications Tab: This is where you can find notifications about missed care events and mishandles

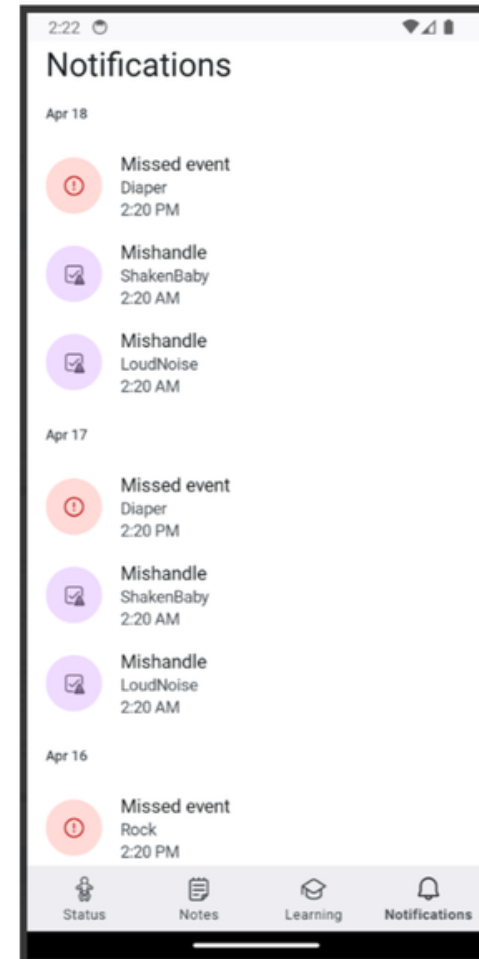
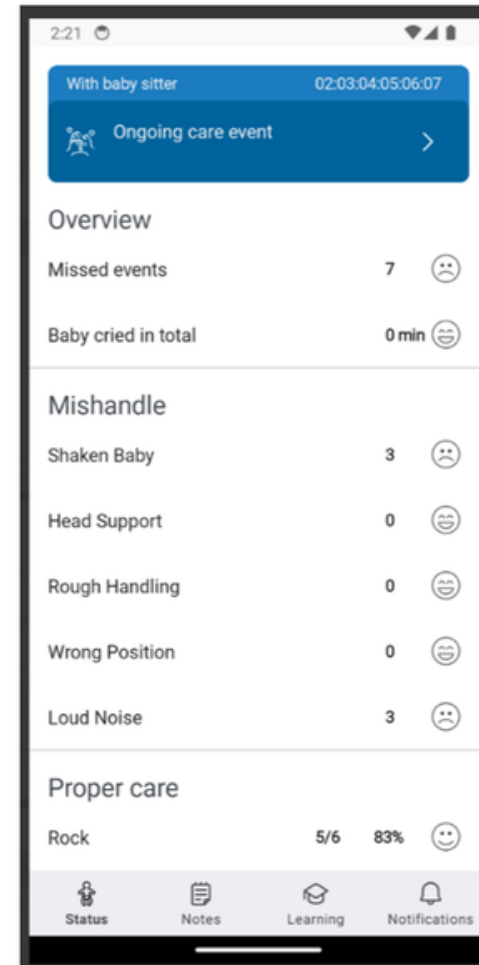

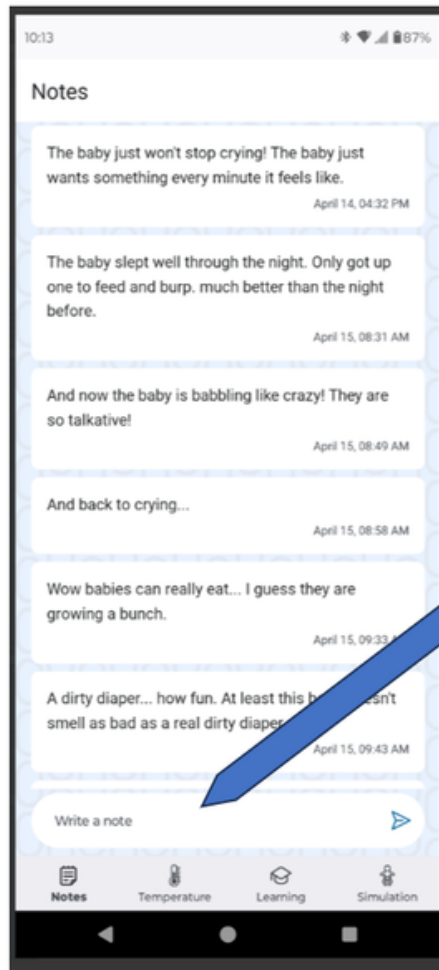
Real-Time Reporting

- Safety precautions



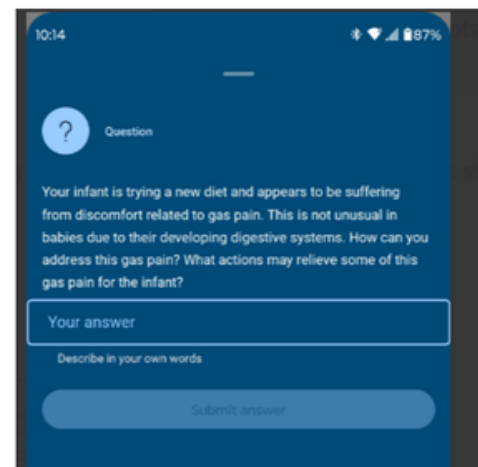

Using the Daily Scenarios

- When students access the app, once each day a scenario will appear.
- Students read and submit their answer in the space provided.
- Instructors can use this as a discussion point, assessment or whole class exercise.

There are 50 scenarios included!

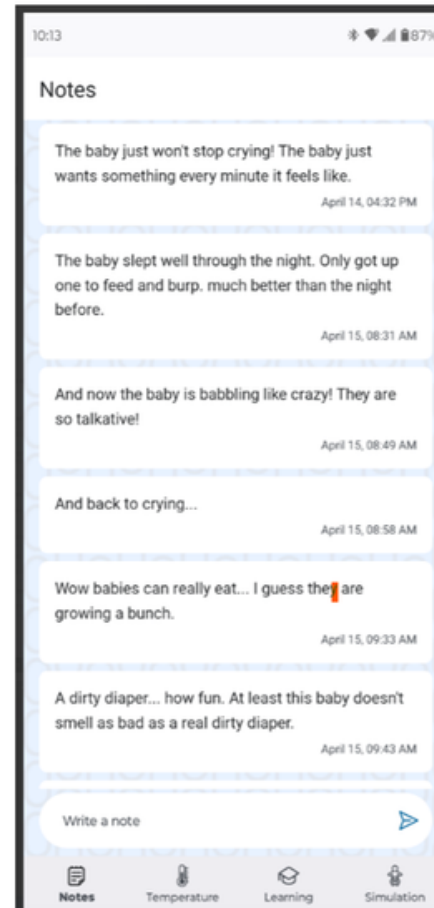
Sample scenario: While attempting to bottle feed the infant in your care, you notice they are having trouble latching to the nipple properly. Your infant is frustrated and is not being fed properly. Despite trying different positions and shapes your baby is not getting the food it needs. How do you improve the bottle-feeding experience for your infant?

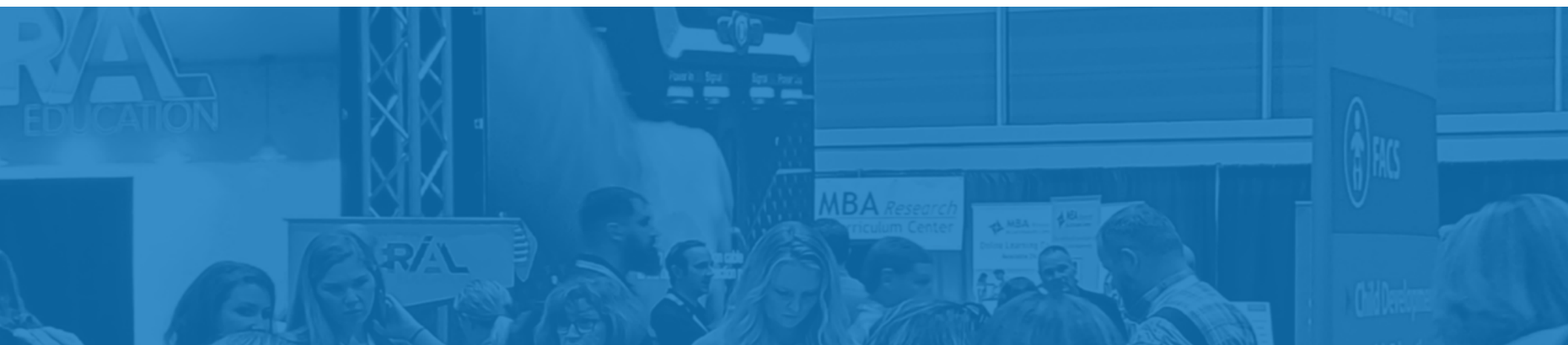


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Using the Notes Field

- Choose a writing prompt and have students journal about it and submit it.
- Require students to answer a daily question on infant care or health and safety.
- Ask infant developmental questions relating to PIES, tummy time or safe sleep positions.
